Policies and Enrollment

Welcome to Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program!

We are pleased to announce our classes in Longmont serving homeschooling families from Longmont, Boulder, Fredrick, Firestone, Hygiene, and Lyons. This is a drop-in program with the option to enroll for full days. Classes are embedded into our full-time program, North Star Microschool, and follow the same rules and expectations. Fran Stuart is a certified Colorado teacher who has been background checked, certified by the Red Cross in CPR/First Aid, and trained to be able to administer medications if needed.

Schedule

School starts January 8th and meets Monday-Wednesday for the first two weeks and then adds Thursdays in on January 25th. Our Spring Break is March 18th-21st. Classes meet Monday-Thursday with Thursday's activities alternating weeks. Our schedule is as follows:

Monday: 9:30 Right Start Math Level B (ages 6-8)

10:30 Right Start Math Level C/D (ages 8-11)

1:30 Art with Kate Otte

Tuesday: Writer's Workshop 9:30-10:30

Private Piano lessons with Lacey Wheeler (times vary)

1:30 Science (possibly)

Wednesday: TBA-Science/Social Studies
Thursday: TBA-Field Trips/Farm Days/Pool

Daily academic and social activities include Reading Intervention, Writer's Workshop, Spanish, outdoor park play, free play, piano practice, crafts, read-aloud, calendar math, and online educational resources such as Prodigy, Education.com, and Guided Readers. If your child drops in for a full day, they are welcome to participate in the daily activities.

Academic class sizes are limited to 10 students. Field Trip/Farm Days capacities are limited to 3 Nalu students, outside of my full-time students unless I have a parent chaperone who is willing to drive. Enrollment options include **drop-in, four-week blocks, and full semester**. Please let us know what classes/events interest you and we will begin the registration process! Feel free to reach out with any questions!

Attendance & Refund Policy

It is expected that students will be in attendance on the days they are registered for, so please only register your child for the days you know they will be able to attend each month. There will be no refunds given to students who are absent for a field trip or elective day they have previously registered for, as we prepay for entrance tickets and materials, and staff for these days based on the number of students registered. In the case of illness or injury, exceptions will be considered, and a refund offered in the form of credit for a future drop-in or class.

Behavior Policy

- To maintain a positive and inclusive atmosphere for our students, we expect that all participants in our program will always treat our students and staff with kindness and respect.
- Foul language, inappropriate jokes, and disrespectful words and/or actions toward our staff or students will not be tolerated.
- If we have a behavior concern with your child, you will receive a phone call from our staff, and we will ask you to address this concern with your child over the phone. If the poor behavior continues the same day after a phone call is made, we will call you again to come and pick up your child immediately for that day.
- We have a zero-tolerance policy for bullying of any kind or intentional physical harm. If your child hits, slaps, scratches, punches, pulls hair, bites, spits on, or kicks another student/staff member, you will be called and expected to pick up your student immediately.
- In the event we have a student who repeatedly exhibits poor behavior that jeopardizes the safety and/or enjoyment of our program for our students and/or staff, we reserve the right to dismiss that student from our program entirely.
- To ensure a conducive learning environment for all students, it is expected that students can complete learning activities in a way that is not disruptive to the learning of the other students in that classroom/group.
- Students who exhibit disruptive behavior will be redirected by the teacher, and should this behavior continue, parents will be contacted to support our efforts to correct the disruptive behavior. If a student continues their disruptive behavior after a parent phone call has been made, they will be separated from the other students and their parents will be called to pick them up.
- We reserve the right to dismiss any student from our program at any time if we feel they are negatively impacting the learning environment and/or safety of our staff and/or students. No tuition refunds will be given for students who miss any classes and/or activities due to poor behavior that leads to early pick-up or dismissal from our program.
- If a parent has prepaid tuition in full and their child is dismissed from our program before the end of our academic semester/calendar year, a refund will be offered for future months (after the current month) that the child will not attend due to dismissal from the program.

Pick up/Drop off

Class-only students may arrive early for class to allow some time for socializing with peers. Pick-up times for morning classes are promptly when scheduled **classes end** and afternoon classes are promptly at 3 pm.

Parents must give written consent for caregivers and relatives to pick up children and provide full contact information for each pick-up person. If an unauthorized person arrives to pick up a child, the child will NOT be released. If a parent, guardian, or designated pick-up person arrives unfit to safely care for the child, another authorized person will be contacted immediately.

If a parent or guardian is late, for pick-up, a teacher will always stay with the child and every attempt will be made to reach all contacts which have been designated.

A fee of \$10.00 will be assessed for every 15 minutes that passes before parents or guardians arrive. This fee will be added to the following month's invoice.

Parenting Safe Children

I have completed Feather Berkower's course called Parenting Safe Children. Listed below are the overarching themes of her program. I am committed to cultivating a deep awareness of the signs and recognizing behaviors that might indicate sex abuse or make a child more vulnerable to it, utilizing the correct language, and creating body safety rules. At NSM we encourage our families to take Feather's course and, upon enrollment for full-time students, will deduct the cost from the first month's tuition. My Household

The members of my household consist of myself, Frances Stuart, my three daughters, Joni Stuart, Laurel Stuart, and Margaret Stuart-Byrne, Margaret's husband, Darragh Byrne, and their baby Sadhbh (Sive) Stuart-Byrne. No member of the household will be held liable for any problems, accidents, or injuries which may occur during school times. I am happy to introduce you and be transparent with any questions you may have regarding household members.

Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program is home to many animal friends including four dogs, two cats, a leopard gecko, a hamster, and a fish. Students and parents/guardians are expected to treat animals with the same kindness and respect as people.

Personal Liability

Parent(s) give me, Frances Stuart permission to be in a one-on-one dynamic with their child. This includes students riding in Fran's 2009 Honda Odyssey van, being in Fran's home (the property at 813 Nelson Park Drive), in public parks, on field trips, or any other previously agreed upon destination. Parents will always be informed daily as to the whereabouts of their child/children.

Neither myself nor my staff will be held liable for injuries or negative experiences sustained while your child attends Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program unless outright negligence can be cited.

Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program will not be held responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of a child's personal belongings.

Firearms and other weapons or dangerous tools are not allowed on Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program's property. There are not any firearms nor weapons of any kind on the property and no one in the household owns or possesses firearms or weapons of any kind.

Academic Disclaimer

I, Frances Stuart, and Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program will not be held responsible for student performance in public academic settings. This includes missed homework assignments, poor test results, or lack of measurable improvements or progress over time. I do not teach to any standardized test; however, I do use the Colorado state standards and benchmarks as a guideline. I tend to focus less on the "grade" level and more on the fundamental understandings and the syntheses of academic concepts presented over time. This is born both of philosophy and

necessity for some students who possess learning challenges. I will do my best to work cooperatively with parents and students to provide optimal academic performance outcomes.

Media Usage

Technology is incorporated for academic purposes sometimes. I have subscriptions to IXL, Guided Readers and Education.com, and Prodigy These programs provide added fun and augment the concepts being taught. I do not lean heavily on technology, and it is used for academic purposes only. I have strict policies regarding the use of the internet. Students are not allowed access to the internet and are always supervised when using the academic programs. In the case of research projects, the internet may sometimes be accessed by some students, and I will obtain permission beforehand.

Emergency Preparedness

Parents or guardians will be notified immediately of an accident, injury, or illness. There will also be an accident report kept on file documenting any incidents. A phone call will be made first to the parent(s) and then, if necessary, to the emergency contact(s) on file. Even if the incident appears minor, I will call so that parents have the option of personally assessing the situation.

We follow guidelines issued by the Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA) regarding natural disasters such as fire, flood, tornado, and procedures for evacuation or sheltering in place.

Smoking

Smoking is not allowed on the Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program's property. If there is a risk of possible exposure to secondhand smoke in a public setting, children will be removed from the area in which secondhand smoke is present immediately.

Reporting Abuse

Nalu Homeschool Enrichment staff are mandatory reporters with the Colorado Department. of Human Services, Division of Childcare. This includes suspected child abuse or neglect. You also have the right to report any suspected abuse. Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline: 1-844-264-5437

Field trips

In the event of a scheduled field trip, a form will be provided in advance of the planned excursion. The form will state the destination, the associated additional costs, method of transport, and will require parent signatures and contact information as well as emergency contact information. In the event of an unscheduled trip, I will ask for verbal and/or text consent before leaving the premises of the Nalu Homeschool Enrichment Program.

- Students will be transported via Fran's 2009 Honda Odyssey Van or parents can choose to drive them to/from the venue. If your child needs a booster or car seat, please bring one at drop-off so that we can label and install it in the van. Each student is expected to wear their seatbelt properly when riding in our van. No eating or drinking is permitted in the car at any time. Failure to follow these rules van may result in your student losing the privilege of attending future field trips, and they will only be permitted to attend future field trips with parental transportation.
- Please apply sunscreen and bug spray on your child before dropping them off for a field trip. Students may bring and apply bug spray or sunscreen so long as they are not aerosol products. Students are also encouraged to wear a hat and sunglasses on field trip days.
- A field trip form will need to be signed for each trip to allow us to transport your child to the designated location. We reserve the right to require a chaperone for any student who may need prolonged, individual behavior support on a field trip, and if a chaperone is not available for that student, he/she will not be permitted to attend the field trip.
- There will be a \$52.50 full-day, drop-in fee for each field trip day a student attends. This **does not include** the price of admission, gift shop purchases, or in-house activities. We try to use the library system when we can to keep admission costs to a minimum. For those enrolled in our full-time program, these days are already included in their tuition cost.

Transportation

Transportation will occur in my 2009 Honda Odyssey van which has additional insurance coverage through State Farm for transporting children who are not my own. In the event of a planned trip, parent or guardian volunteers may offer the use of their vehicles and drive children to the destination. students will be required to use parent-approved booster seats if size and age dictate the necessity. Parents will always be notified as to the whereabouts of their child.

Student Health Information Important Information Regarding Children with Health Concerns/Allergies

The safety of our students is our number one priority. If your student has any medical concerns and/or allergies (environmental or food), you must include that information on your registration form. Frances Stuart is trained in CPR and first aid, including training for administering EpiPens. While we have procedures in place to ensure the safety of our students, if your child has any severe allergies or medical concerns we feel cannot be accommodated at our facility, we reserve the right to deny acceptance into our program.

Any student medications will be stored in a cool, darkened, and locked place in the home. Unused medications will be returned to the parent or guardian.

I am certified to administer medications. Medications will be recorded and stored appropriately as per my daycare license. When medications are administered, there will be a written record kept including date, time, and dose.

Sick Policy

Students demonstrating any symptoms of illness should be kept at home. If your child wakes up and needs any kind of medication at home to treat symptoms of illness, please do not send them to our center that day for the safety of our students and staff. If a student demonstrates signs of illness while at our center, the student will be separated from the group and made comfortable in a separate room. We will contact those listed as emergency contacts to arrange for the immediate pick-up of the child. Students must be fever-free for 24 hours before they are allowed to return, and some illnesses may require a doctor's note for readmittance. We will allow students who have been prescribed medication that needs to be taken during their time at our facility an opportunity to do so, and a medication log will be kept on file. There are no refunds for days missed due to illness.

Because of the small number of families participating in our learning community. NSM does not require masks

Because of the small number of families participating in our learning community, NSM does not require masks currently, however, we do have policies with regard to safe health practices.

These are the NSM policies for illness:

- Please be transparent if you, your child, or anyone else in your household is sick.
- If anyone in your household has a fever, a contagious illness, or is actively feeling unwell with a stomach bug, congestion, or cough your child is not welcome to attend NSM that day.
- I would like to have a conversation about what is going on regarding any illness before you send your child to my home.
- Children will not be admitted when running a fever. They must be fever-free, without the use of fever-reducing medication, for a full 24 hours before returning to school. I consider a fever to be above 100.4 degrees F.

These are the Nalu/NSM policies for COVID-19:

- If you or your child have a known exposure to COVID-19, please notify me as soon as possible.
- In the case that <u>anyone in your household</u> tests positive for COVID-19, a mandatory five-day absence from school is required.
- After five days, the student needs to have a negative COVID-19 test result and remain asymptomatic to return to school.
